Gospel: *John 20:19-31*

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

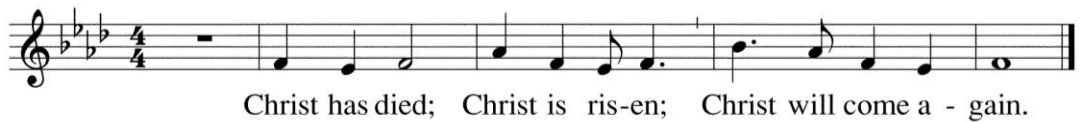

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

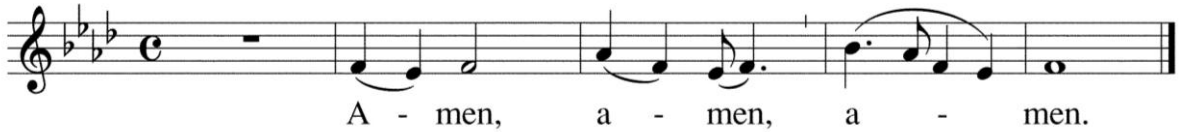



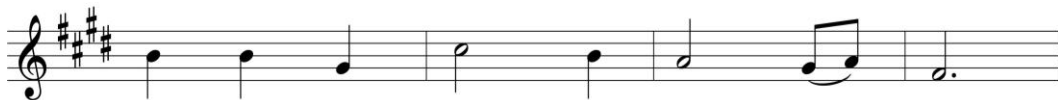

Movie on May 18th: *My Name is Pauli Murray*

After the service on Sunday May 18th, our Community Outreach Committee will show the film *My Name is Pauli Murray*. In 1977, the Rev. Dr. Pauli Murray became the first African American woman ordained a priest in the Episcopal Church; she is honored on the calendar of the Episcopal Church as a saint, someone whose life reflected the life and teachings of Jesus in an extraordinary way. Prior to her ordination, Pauli was a brilliant lawyer and activist whose work was foundational to the civil rights movement. Pauli also struggled with gender identity, and the film explores this aspect of her life as well. The film runs 90 minutes and will be shown in the lounge at 11:30 a.m. after a brief coffee hour; a light lunch will be available for those who would like to stay and watch.
